REMINDERS FOR THE DAY BEFORE SURGERY

<ul> <li>□ Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the day before your surgery.</li> <li>□ Bring an empty tote bag large enough to fit your clothing and shoes to the surgical facility.</li> <li>□ Patients with medium-long hair length, please tie your hair back neatly with a hair tie.</li> <li>□ Leave valuables at home.</li> </ul>
SURGICAL SITE PREP  Use over-the-counter benzoyl peroxide (acne) wash to cleanse the shoulder and underarm daily for one week prior to surgery. Some examples are the generic brand of Clearasil or OxyClean.  Take a shower the night before surgery and use ½ the soap packet to cleanse the surgical shoulder thoroughly.  Sleep on clean sheets the night before surgery.
<ul> <li>On the morning of surgery, take another shower and use the rest of the soap packet to cleanse the surgical shoulder thoroughly.</li> <li>Do not apply deodorant, powder or lotions.</li> </ul>
ICE MACHINE RENTALS  ☐ For ice machine rental, contact Jim "The Iceman" at (561) 876-6796 as soon as possible. Availability cannot be guaranteed on short notice. This is recommended, but not required.
<u>CLOTHING</u> ☐ Wear an oversized button down shirt to the surgical facility.
SLING  ☐ If you were fitted for a sling, please remember to bring your sling to surgery.
HOME EXERCISE PROGRAM  Study the post op exercises and bring the copy with you to your first appointment after surgery with Dr. Diaz. Unless otherwise instructed, do not begin the exercises prior to your first post-op appointment.
